

## Introduction

This Module demonstrates that the process of applying the 2005 Code to a typical design using the Division B provisions—i.e. acceptable solutions—is very similar to the process of applying the 1995 Code.

## Applying the 2005 Code

You will likely apply the 2005 Code using Division B most of the time.

Each Division B technical requirement helps satisfy at least one objective of the Code. Therefore, it is not necessary to consult the objectives in Division A when applying Division B.

The process of applying the 2005 Code is very similar to that of applying the 1995 Code. In each process there is:

- legislation that dictates the enforcement of the Code,
- a statement relaying the general application of the Code,
- two methods for compliance,
- direction on the scope of application of each Part, and
- applicable technical provisions.

While the 2005 Code differs in content and organization and includes new tools to assist in interpreting and verifying Code compliance, the process of applying the 2005 Code when using Division B provisions is virtually the same as the process for the 1995 Code.
